New quarantine law implemented in The Netherlands as per 01 June

As per 01 June a new **quarantine law** (**click here**) has been implemented for passenger coming from high-risk countries. A list of these high-risk countries can be downloaded from the weblink above.

Passenger arriving in The Netherlands from these high-risk countries must adhere to a 10-day quarantine and have to fill out a form stating the address and telephone number in The Netherlands

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Amsterdam at the arrival gate to the gate-runner which can be recognized by his/her jacket and badge. Also when parked at the buffer, the gate-runner will collect the envelope from the crew. Passengers coming from a high-risk country but transferring in a low-risk country and then traveling on to The Netherlands still need to go into quarantine but since their arriving aircraft will not be met by a gate-runner, keep the form to his/herself. There are a number of exemptions for the compulsory quarantine which you may find by **clicking here**.

Although the Inspectorate for the Living environment and Transport (ILT/CAA) will be maintaining this law and will do spot-checks at airlines, it is not expected that in the first couple of weeks any fines will be levied for non-compliance. The paper quarantine form is supposed to be replaced by a digital solution no later than 01 July 2021.
