Herewith a short update on the pre-consultation on airport charges Schiphol, for the 3 years 2022/2024.

Schiphol has invited airlines, BARIN, IATA for three pre-consultation meetings and has scheduled the consultation meeting itself on September 30. On 28 of September we have a special meeting on cost developments. In these meetings we have a constructive dialogue with Schiphol and we share our views.

Main points of discussion and disagreement:

- 1. the proposed increase of the charges for 2022/23/24.
- 2. "sharing the pain"
- 3. too often exceeding the budgets; no strict budget control

It's good to realize the so-called "Luchtvaartwet" (Aviation Act) defines clearly the do's and don'ts of the Consultation. Schiphol is strictly adhering to the designed for a crisis like the Covid-19 one. As such it's not acceptable to make the airlines pay for all the deficits Schiphol experienced over the past two years. The quote below of Willie Walsh (Director General of IATA) says it all.

"Schiphol's intention to massively raise its charges in the middle of a crisis is an absurdity that only a delusional monopoly could propose. The idea that airlines should pay higher charges to make up for airport revenue shortfalls when demand evaporate for everybody is totally unacceptable. The real world solution is first to cut costs and improve efficiency. After that, if substantial financial gaps still exist, then it should seek support from investors who benefited from years of steady returns before the crisis. Schiphol needs to contribute to recovery, not set it back."

BARIN was quoted in various media. Some quotes were correct, some not. We still look forward to reach a fair deal for all stakeholders with Schiphol.

We will inform our Airline Members in our BGA this Thursday more in detail.

Schiphol extends relief measures into Q4 2021

In her letter dated 14th September, Schiphol announced the continuation of relief measures for Q4 2021 as per below. The following measures will be effective in Q4 2021:

- For the period 1 October 2021 31 December 2021, a discount of 5% on the Landing & Take-off charges will be applicable.
- From 1 October 2021 31 December 2021 the payment terms of all airport charges will be as follows:
 - Invoices paid within 30 days will be rewarded with a discount of 2%.

• When not applying for discounts, payment terms remain at 60 days.

These relief measures are the same as those for Q3 of 2021, with the exception of the postponement of an overall airport charges increase of 5%. As communicated on 30 October 2020, this increase would take effect on 1 April 2021. However, as part of our relief measures for Q2 and Q3, we have delayed its implementation until 1 October 2021.

Compulsory quarantine partly abolished when vaccinated as per 22 September

As per today, 22nd of September a compulsory quarantine of 10 days will be abolished for passengers coming from very high-risk countries (e.g. currently USA or UK) when able to prove they were completely vaccinated. The EU-entry restriction has been lifted.
