The financial results published by Schiphol were 'mixed'. Yes, a profit of € 61 million, but without the NOW government grants received, gains on investment property and ADP, net results for the first half year show a loss of € 33 million.

Most import news this week was the decision of the Raad van State regarding the proposal to reduce night flights. They concluded the process was not followed properly and alternatives were not sufficiently taken into consideration. Back to the drawing board!

BARIN and aviation sector partners have sent letter to Finance Minister Kaag to request substantial funding

Late July BARIN and all major sector partners sent a letter to Finance Minister Mrs. Sigrid Kaag to urge for a strong funding for a sustainability program for the aviation sector. The current reserved budget for the aviation industry is very minimal in comparison with the € 35 billion the Dutch Government has reserved for other industries. Our plea is to allocate the proceeds of the ticket-tax to sustainability initiatives in our sector so that the intention with which the Government introduced the ticket tax effectively goes to reducing our footprint instead of the money just ending up in the Government's general budget.



Minister of Infrastructure & Watermanagement Harbers responds to BARIN and IATA letter on EU261/2004

On July 27th a reply by Minister Mark Harbers was received on the letter sent by BARIN and IATA on March 22nd, in which we alerted the bizarre circumstances when dealing with EU261/2004 claims in case of a bankruptcy of an intermediary. We are of the opinion that airlines have fulfilled all their obligations when having refunded unused tickets to the party who has actually purchased the ticket from the airline. The ILT is of a different opinion and the Minister backs this up. However, he also requests the sector to come up with alternative suggestion and we will go through the EC to further pursue this.

Royal Schiphol Group presents Halfyear Figures H1'22

On 26th August, Royal Schiphol Group (RSG) reported the financial results for H1 2022 with a positive net result of € 61 million. The positive result was due to a strong rebounce in traffic but also due to support in staff wages from the Government due to COVID-19 and asset revaluation. Without these positive influences, the result would have been a minus € 33 million.
