# Court in The Hague rules in RBV vs. Dutch State case

On March 20, the Judge of the Court in The Hague ruled in a case requested by the 'Recht op Bescherming tegen Vliegtuighinder' (RBV) versus the Dutch State, that the State has not done enough to protect inhabitants of the areas around Schiphol Airport against noise hindrance caused by aviation. Although the Judge did not condemn the Dutch State to reduce the actual number of flight movements, the Court did order the Dutch Stat to pass a new Airport Traffic Decree (LVB) to find a legal basis for the total number of flight movements to be operated from and to Schiphol Airport. The time allowed to get new legislation in place is set at 12 months from the date of the verdict.
