BARIN and the ANVR (Algemene Nederlandse Vereniging van Reisagenten) organized a symposium last week, exploring the current state of aviation and how the future can or should look like.

Representatives from the aviation and travel industry, government, and environmental organizations gathered at Transavia's headquarters for in-depth discussions on the state and future of aviation in the Netherlands.

We explored the current challenges and opportunities for the sector. We examined aviation from multiple perspectives:

- The impact on the environment and climate
- The demand for mobility, now and in the future
- The importance of international connectivity
- The relationship between our investment climate and Schiphol

Amsterdam Airport Schiphol announces changes in airport fees for 2026

As known, Amsterdam Airport Schiphol has set the increase of airport fees in 2025 at 41% (after comparable increases seen in the preceding period 2022-2024). For 2026, the intended increase is set at 5%, however the airport's management now realizes that she is becoming pretty expensive with yet another increase. In fact Schiphol has become the Europe's second most expensive airport in airline fees. Although lowering any increase is welcomed by the airlines, this intended cancelation can be seen as 'a drop on a hot plate'.

The second part of the afternoon was a panel discussion including Ourania Georgoutsakou-MD at Airlines4Europe, Sijas Akkerman-Director Natuur en Milieufederatie Noord-Holland, Daan Lenderink-Director of Schiphol Travel International, Bert van Mourik-Program Manager Aviation at Natuur & Milieu and Marnix Fruitema-Chairman of BARIN. From investing the proceeds of the ticket tax in sustainability goals of the aviation sector to the inter-dependability of the investment and economic climate vis-á-vis the role of Schiphol. Participating MP's were Habtemu de

Hoop of GL-PvdA, Peter de Groot of the VVD, Marcel Hanegraaff of CDA, Tjerk Zeitsen of BBB and Martin Goudzwaard of JA21. This week the 'election recess' of the House of Representatives started with the national elections to be organized on 29th October.

Central Bureau for Statistics acknowledges that price-level in The Netherlands is 3.3% higher

Last week the CBS (Centraal Bureau voor de Statistiek) published a price comparison between September this year vs. last and acknowledges that the price-level of consumer goods is 3.3% higher than the previous year. From the details published last Tuesday is shows that beef, coffee and chocolate rise most in price. "The food-inflation still is 3,7%", according to Rabobank economist Hugo Erken. "These are products that we buy every week By which we are being confronted continually by a high inflation.

"Flights may have become cheaper due to the fact that the Euro has become more expensive versus the US Dollar; about 6% in a year's time", says ING economist Klok. That may have put the price of international traders down. At the opening of the Parliamentary year (Prinsjesdag) the Dutch Cabinet announced an increase of the aviation tax on long(er) haul flights.
